Pastor's Corner

To fulfill our faith and the commandments of God rely on putting it into practice. It is not enough to profess the faith and knowing God's commandments without putting it into practice in one's life.

We have heard from this Sunday's gospel that Jesus was tested by an expert/scholar of the law. So being an expert/scholar of the law, no part of the law was not known or unfamiliar to him. That's why when Jesus asked him what was written in the law and how he read it, he answered to Jesus correctly and perfectly. But his knowledge and expertise of the law were not enough to justify him because he lacked one thing (i.e. putting into practice what the law stated).

The true observant of the commandment is the one who fulfils it by living it out into his/her life. The true believer of God is the one who acted righteous deeds to his/her neighbors who are in need.

Let us listen then to the moral teaching of Moses in this Sunday's first reading "to carry it out" in our heart the law and the commandment of God by imitating the Good Samaritan has done to his neighbor in the gospel that we have heard. Jesus commands us "go and do likewise." Amen.

Adopt a Dream Project

The Our Lady of the Rosary Stewardship Committee is inviting each parishioner to join us in partnering with Father Joe's Villages to adopt a family or adopt a teen this summer.

The Stewardship Committee strives to develop and sustain a culture of actively engaged disciples of Jesus Christ, committed to a stewardship way of life. We are continually striving to build a vibrant community in which every parishioner is invited to play an active role. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we believe that together we can make a difference in this community and in the world.

Adopt a Family

Some of the homeless who have gone through the program at Father Joe's are offered supportive permanent housing at the end of their stay. Coming off the street they often have very little when moving in to their new homes. By adopting a family we can help them furnish their new homes, room by room.

Family Profile

Taylor is a 52 year old woman born and raised in San Diego who became homeless when her position as a customer service supervisor at a local bank was terminated after 24 years on the job. Taylor is accompanied by her partner Thomas of 34 years and her 18 year old autistic son Timothy. She and her family were referred to Father Joe's Village and checked into the emergency shelter program for families after being "put out" of their daughter's home. Previous to living with their daughter, they lived in their own home for 13 years but were faced with an unlawful detainer when they were unable to pay their rent. Her partner Thomas was the sole caretaker of Timothy until he presented with serious health issues that made it very challenging for her to care for him or seek employment. With the aid of her Rapid Rehousing Program case manager, the program's rental assistance, Taylor's willpower and positive outlook, she was afforded a one bedroom apartment. While they didn't have much income to provide for basic household needs, they have received food stamps and worked to buy some basics. Two weeks after Taylor was housed, her RRH case manager conducted a home visit and found Taylor and her family to be self-sufficient, working hard to make it work but still quite happy in their new home.

Adopt a Teen

The Toussaint Academy for Homeless Teens supports homeless and runaway children, ages 14 to 18. Toussaint prepares young people to develop a sense of self-worth and a connection to the community. In addition The Academy trains teen's skills towards future employment.

Teen Profile

Shannon came to Toussaint at age 14. She was referred by The San Diego Youth Services' emergency teen shelter, Storefront. Shannon became homeless because her family over-welcomed their stay at a family members' house, and her mom had too many health issues that prevented her from getting adequate housing. Shannon has now been at Toussaint for nearly 4 years. She is a senior at San Diego Early Middle College and scheduled to graduate in June 2016. She worked at Pet Lounge for over a year until they recently closed. She has been accepted to California State University, Monterrey Bay, and will be moving up there this summer to begin classes in July. Her goal is to study behavioral and social sciences.

BACKGROUND OF THE LITURGY

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading is from Deuteronomy. The substance of this book was composed in the northern kingdom (Israel), probably in the ninth century before Christ. When Israel was destroyed (731 B.C.), Deuteronomy was brought south to Judah (with the E- tradition). Deuteronomy gathered dust and was ignored until it was "discovered" and made the source of the great religious renewal under Josiah (c. 620 B.C.)

Today's reading is from a sermon of Moses near the end of the book. Moses says that God's law is not so far away that we need to search for it. It is not so esoteric that few can understand it. If people follow it, all the world will marvel at how wise the people are.

How true! Think of the billions of dollars which could be saved if only people followed the commandments of God. Suppose everyone practiced purity and monogamous marriage: There would be no abortion or divorce. Suppose everyone respected everyone's property: There would be no jails for thieves and no need for insurance. If everyone were honest and respected the rights of others, what a wonderful world it would be.

The second reading is one of the most profound passages in the New Testament. At the time of Jesus, the Jews believed that the Torah was the ultimate, eternal, unchangeable self-revelation of God. God made all things with the Torah as model and purpose. All things were made to fit in with the Torah.

(Remember the passage of the gospel where Jesus says that the Sabbath was made for man and not man for the Sabbath? This would be blasphemy to the Pharisees who thought that man was made for the Sabbath!) All things were made for the Torah and unto the Torah.

In Paul's theology, Jesus has replaced the Torah. From all eternity, he is the model and purpose of creation. All things are made through him, for him, and unto him. Note that in Paul's view Jesus is the model and purpose - the incarnate Jesus! Speculating a bit further, if Jesus is the model and purpose of creation, then in God's eternal view, the incarnation was a quasi-necessity: Creation

could not be modeled on the incarnate Jesus Christ unless he had become man!

The gospel is the parable of the Good Samaritan. Jerusalem is fifteen miles from Jericho, but there is an increase in elevation from 800 feet below sea level to 2600 feet above sea level. The road was notorious for bandits.

To a Jew, the worst possible people were the Samaritans. They were considered as heretics and half-breeds and no good could ever come from them. One wonders what a self-respecting Samaritan would be doing on the road from Jerusalem to Jericho! Samaritans would never be caught near Jerusalem.

But the story is a parable — a story with a strange twist. The twist is that those who should have done good did not. And this low-life, rotten person cares for the person who fell among thieves. The lawyer will not even use the word "Samaritan" when Jesus asks who was "neighbor." Jesus tells the lawyer to do likewise (as the Samaritan had done) and to recognize that he is his neighbor.

Leviticus 19:18 commands that we love neighbor as our own self. The lawyer tried to rationalize about who his neighbor was. His neighbor is even the man he considered the worst possible individual.

Would it not be wonderful if we put these readings together and put them into practice? All things are made through and unto Christ. If we consider ourselves to be of Christ, then we do good to all persons. And if we keep God's law, all people will see how wise we are.

Please, Come to Church Dressed Appropriately!

To be modestly and tastefully dressed is a sign of respect for God, for our selves, and for others. It's a false assumption that God does not care how we dress. Jesus told us, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers, you do it to me." If our attire is indecently provocative (short shorts, strapless, backless, spaghetti strap dresses/tops, or displaying cleavage), displaying unwholesome graphics (skulls, advertisements, scantily clad people) or tattered, it becomes offensive to our brothers and sisters who are worshipping the Lord and therefore offensive to God's Majesty. Ask this question: "Would you dress this way before God?" You are! He sees everything and you are in His house.
