
ACA Goal Reached!!!



BACKGROUND OF THE LITURGY

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading of today's Mass is a rather touching story of the death and resuscitation of the son of the widow of Zarephath by the prophet Elijah. It is a tender story full of theological implications.

In fact, the late Anglican patristic and liturgical scholar, Dom Gregory Dix, cited the passage from the first reading as an example of the biblical idea of remembrance: "In the scriptures both of the Old and New Testaments, anamnesis and the cognate verb have the sense of re-calling or re-presenting before God an event in the past, so that it becomes operative here and now by its effects... So the widow of Sarepta (1 Kings 17:18) complains that Elijah has come 'to re-call to (God's) remembrance (anamnesis) my iniquity' and therefore her son has died."

The woman expresses a common belief that any great tragedy was a punishment due to sin. (Jesus directly repudiates this belief in John 9:3.) In bringing her son back to life, Elijah proves to the widow that he is a genuine prophet of the Lord, that the word from God is effective - it does what it says. What God says, happens.

In the second reading, Paul takes up an elaborate defense of his apostleship. Paul's opponents in the Galatian community did not like that he released Gentile converts from the obligation to observe the Jewish law, and they sought to undermine his authority by casting doubt on whether he was a true apostle. They said that his gospel was only secondhand, of mere human origin, and not directly from Christ.

Paul rebuts these accusations by insisting that his gospel came by way of a direct revelation from God in a resurrection appearance. This leads him to give an account of all that happened in his life before his startling revelation, beginning with his persecution of the Church and zealous, pharisaical observance of the Jewish law.


In the gospel, God "visits" his people when Jesus raises the son of the widow of Nain. In features similar to the first reading, Jesus encounters the dead man being carried out of the town's gate. Moved with pity for the widowed mother, he

touched the coffin and commanded the young man to get up. When he gave the son back to his mother, the crowd was seized with fear and they began to praise God saying "A great prophet has risen among us," and "God has visited his people."

The response of the widow of Zarephath and that of the crowd at Nain provide the homilist with rich material for proclamation. The word "visit" is an important word of the Bible. Yahweh is essentially a God who visits, not only to punish but also to bring salvation.

God's visit to Israel in the ancient prophets; his visit in the Christ-event, bringing life out of death; his extension of that visit through the word and sacraments of the Church—that could be the theme of today's homily.

In all of this, God has chosen to mediate his presence through human beings. Here we have the theological basis for the necessity of the Church for salvation. The homilist could help the assembly recognize their own role in assisting the proclamation of God's word and in bringing back to life those who are not in the life of grace.

Please, Come to Church Dressed Appropriately!

To be modestly and tastefully dressed is a sign of respect for God, for our selves, and for others. It's a false assumption that God does not care how we dress. Jesus told us, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers, you do it to me." If our attire is indecently provocative (short shorts, strapless, backless, spaghetti strap dresses/tops, or displaying cleavage), displaying unwholesome graphics (skulls, advertisements, scantily clad people) or tattered, it becomes offensive to our brothers and sisters who are worshipping the Lord and therefore offensive to God's Majesty. Ask this question: "Would you dress this way before God?" You are! He sees everything and you are in His house.
