

BACKGROUND OF THE LITURGY Sixth Sunday of Easter

In every age, the Church confronts new problems. These problems must be faced in the light of the unchanging gospel. As Paul says in Galatians, there is no new gospel. The truth of God was delivered once and for all through Jesus Christ. It remains for the Church to understand that truth more perfectly and to face all problems in the light of that truth.

Today's Mass describes the first problem of the primitive Church: Whether a person had to become a Jew before he became a Christian. The gospel tells us that the Holy Spirit will always remain in the Church so that she always professes Christ's truth. The second reading is John's vision of the New Jerusalem coming down from heaven, and in which everything is perfect.

At the time of Jesus, the Pharisees believed that the Torah was delivered once and for all to Moses on Mt. Sinai. Though delivered in time the Torah was eternal. It was the ultimate and unchangeable self-revelation of God. The Pharisees distinguished 613 precepts in the Torah; if one kept those, one would find life. An integral part of being a Jew was to look forward to the coming of the Messiah, the Anointed Son of David, who would bring about perfect justice and peace, an end to all suffering and death, and the beginning of the resurrection of the dead.

Many Jews were perfectly willing to admit that Jesus was the Messiah. But if the Torah was eternal and unchangeable, that meant that all persons had to be Jews before they could be Christians. There was a fierce battle between those who wanted acceptance of Jews into salvation and those who wanted all Gentiles to become Jews first.

In such circumstances, the leaders of the Church gathered at Jerusalem. Today's first reading describes only a part of that first council. The upshot was that Gentiles did not have to be Torah-true Jews; they could be admitted to salvation by baptism. The council was conscious of its guidance by the Holy Spirit. It declared, "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us..." The gospel is Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit. He says that the "Paraclete" will guide them in all truth. "Paraclete" is translated "advocate." The picture is of a defense attorney who stands by us at all times

In the First Century, the Church confronted the problem of the binding force of the Torah. There was also the problem of the Person of Jesus: Was he God just "appearing" as human, or was he truly human as well as divine?

The first ecumenical councils of the Church confronted these problems. In our times, who would have thought that marriage would ever be thought of as between two persons of the same sex? And who would have thought that the priesthood would be open to women, however holy? Who would have thought that sex would be considered as recreation, and the product of sexual union to be just a bit of protoplasm?

When we, the Church, confront the issues of today, we are ridiculed as reactionary and right wing. It hurts. But we must remain true to the liberating revelation of Jesus Christ. He still guides his Church. The Holy Spirit is still with us, the gospel is joy-filled and liberating if only we follow it. Regardless of the names that they call us, let us have confidence that the Lord is with us.

Please, Come to Church Dressed Appropriately!

To be modestly and tastefully dressed is a sign of respect for God, for our selves, and for others. It's a false assumption that God does not care how we dress. Jesus told us, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers, you do it to me." If our attire is indecently provocative (short shorts, strapless, backless, spaghetti strap dresses/tops, or displaying cleavage), displaying unwholesome graphics (skulls, advertisements, scantly clad people) or tattered, it becomes offensive to our brothers and sisters who are worshipping the Lord and therefore offensive to God's Majesty. Ask this question: "Would you dress this way before God?" You are! He sees everything and you are in His house.
