
Our Lady of the Rosary Mission Statement



BACKGROUND OF THE LITURGY Pentecost

In these notes, we shall consider three different aspects of Pentecost. First, the Jewish background; second, the Scripture readings; and third, some reflections on the Holy Spirit.

Jewish Background. Pentecost comes from the Greek word for "fiftieth." It was a Jewish feast fifty days after Passover. The Jewish name is "Shabat" which means "a week of..." It is a "week of weeks" after Passover; even today, it is called the "Feast of Weeks."

Originally it was an agricultural feast for the full in-gathering of the barley harvest. It was one of three pilgrimage feasts mandated by the Torah. See Leviticus 23:15-21. At the time of Jesus, every male Jew within a radius of thirty miles from Jerusalem had to appear before the Lord at the Temple. But this became the most popular of Jewish festivals; the Jews from all over the world frequently came to Jerusalem for it.

At some time in Jewish history, the celebration took on new meanings. One meaning was covenant and covenant renewal. This theme may have been borrowed from Exodus. Exodus indicates that the Israelites arrived in Mt. Sinai fifty days after their departure from Egypt (i.e. fifty days after Passover).

By an accommodation, then, the theme of covenant came into the festival. When Moses received the Torah from God on Mt. Sinai, there were great theophanies, including fire, shaking and wind. These are strikingly similar to the theophany which happened when the Holy Spirit descended on Pentecost!

In the Jewish festival there were also overtones of the inclusion of Gentiles in the saving plan of God. Some parts of Scripture alluded to God's saving plan to include Gentiles. Isaiah 66 is perhaps the most universal in its "outlook.

Reflections on the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is not weird or strange or exclusive. Unfortunately, some in the so-called. Charismatic Movement seems to have made him this way. Such as, "you don't have the Holy Spirit" unless you've been "baptized in the Holy Spirit." Or you really don't have the Spirit unless you speak in tongues or have some other strange phenomenon. Those who emphasize the. "strange" should carefully read 1 Corinthians 14.

The presence of the Holy Spirit is not necessarily an emotional experience. One may be filled with the Holy Spirit and "feel" nothing. On the other hand, the real presence of the Holy Spirit is often difficult to grasp.

Yet, if we believe in the Holy Spirit, we believe that he is here. And, more and more, as we believe in God as Creator, and in Jesus as Redeemer, and in the Real Presence of Christ in sacraments, so we must realize the Real Presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives and those of others.

We have to keep reminding ourselves again and again. We do believe, Lord; help our unbelief. On this Pentecost Sunday, let us resolve: Daily we shall remind ourselves of the implications of our belief. We are truly temples of the Holy Spirit. Let us live like it ... and pray that all may do the same.

Please, Come to Church Dressed Appropriately!

To be modestly and tastefully dressed is a sign of respect for God, for our selves, and for others. It's a false assumption that God does not care how we dress. Jesus told us, "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers, you do it to me." If our attire is indecently provocative (short shorts, strapless, backless, spaghetti strap dresses/tops, or displaying cleavage), displaying unwholesome graphics (skulls, advertisements, scantly clad people) or tattered, it becomes offensive to our brothers and sisters who are worshipping the Lord and therefore offensive to God's Majesty. Ask this question: "Would you dress this way before God?" You are! He sees everything and you are in His house.
